Tanja holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the North Carolina School of the Arts and a Master of Music Degree from the Manhattan School of Music. She was honored with the prestigious Women of Achievement Award in 2015 from the General Federation of Women's Clubs of North Carolina, an international volunteer service organization. The Women of Achievement Award recognizes outstanding women for their significant contributions to the state of North Carolina. Bechtler served as an orchestral player for the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra for 12 years. She is the founder and director of the Bechtler Ensemble, which is in residency at Queens University. She also spearheaded the Charlotte Composers Forum with regional composers from the Carolinas.
